

THE PROBLEM

Globally, 700 million people, mostly women and children, survive on less than \$1.90/day (UNICEF). Without help, these families face a nearly insurmountable challenge. Many kids grow up in broken homes with poorly educated parents and grandparents and drop out of school early, only to repeat the destructive patterns of their families.



ER held its first kids club in 1997 and continues to serve the Quito Recycling community 25 years later.

THE SOLUTION

With your support, ER helps people break the bonds of generational poverty. Our 25 years of experience has taught us the best way to help people succeed in this fight is by investing in their communities in three strategic areas.

Education Reinforcement

ER Dream Centers place emphasis on education. They offer youth a safe after-school environment where they receive help with homework, mentoring, nutrition, discipleship and more.

Life Skills & Livelihood Training

ER teaches income-generating skills like advanced sewing, soapmaking and artisan skills. The goal is to create sustainable means of personal income.

Leadership Development

ER trains global and national leaders on four continents through in-person summits, personal coaching and learning materials.

TEACHER, TEACHER: DREAM CENTER STUDENT POURS INTO OTHERS

<u>Mutsa</u>*, age 8, is a grade 3 student who has been enrolled in the Fish Hoek Dream Center for two years. She is full of joy and laughter. She dreams of being a teacher and often helps the kids who are struggling with homework.

Always ready to help, Mutsa's heart is full of compassion. She loves to play "Teacher, Teacher" with the younger students. Mutsa has the impressive ability to offer genuine help to her peers without making them feel insecure.

Mutsa's faith is growing as well. During devotions, she learned how God spoke to Joseph about his future through dreams. The next afternoon, Mutsa told her teacher she prayed for God to give her a dream. She described her dream: "A friend and I were walking through a forest. We found a house with lots of children. But it was so sad because they didn't have mommies or daddies. So, we took care of them."

MERCEDES STRIVES FORWARD

Long-time member of the Quito Recycling Community, Mercedes, has become an anchor for the Quito Women's Program. Despite difficult financial and physical circumstances, she never stops depending on God to sustain her. She has been encouraged in her faith through ER's Teresa Jimenez.

Mercedes now counsels women who are struggling and is constantly sharing her faith. Mercedes no longer recycles, instead cleans at a local gym and for families. Finances are tight, but she continues to persevere and trust God. Her dream is to own her own home.

BREAKTHROUGH: DREAM CENTER STUDENT STUDYING PHARMACEUTICALS

<u>Belén</u> has come a long way. She has a dream, goals and hope for her future. Belén was raised in extreme poverty in Ecuador. Her mother is a recycler who has struggled to provide for her family. Despite these trials, Belén recounts her childhood as being calm and being surrounded by love. Her mother has been a part of the Quito Women's Program for many years.

At age 10, Belén enrolled in the Quito Dream Center and became a hard-working student where she received tutoring, encouragement and support from her teachers and peers. She credits them with her knowledge of the Word of God and for helping her feel safe, despite her difficult realities.



Belén successfully navigated virtual school during the pandemic and achieved what had previously been unattainable in the recycling community – she graduated from high school in 2021. Today, Belén is enrolled in a Higher Education Technical Institute which is a first for our Dream Center students! She is studying pharmaceuticals. Her dream is to graduate in two years and build a successful life for herself, her family and her community.

FEISTY GIRL BECOMES DREAM CENTER SPITFIRE

Maggie* was a five-year-old troublemaker. She spent much of her time on the streets acting out. After she enrolled in the Cavite Dream Center in Metro Manila her demeanor changed. She is now much more respectful and prides herself on being a good example and leader to the other kids. We are excited to see how she continues to grow at the Dream Center.


MOM OF SIX BOYS FINDS JOY


